



## A. Lou Stubits

January 18, 1924 - January 12, 2004

A. Lou Stubits, 79, of "The Valley", Syracuse, New York died Monday, January 12, 2004 at Community General Hospital, Onondaga Hill, New York.

Lou was born January 18, 1924 in Danielsville, Pennsylvania, the son of Mathias and Mary Stubits. He lived in Syracuse for the past 53 years. He retired from Carrier Corp. after 32 years. He was a member of the Valley Men's Club, the American Legion Post 1468, the VFW #403, the Angler's Association, a life member of the Elbridge Rod & Gun Club and was an honorary member of the Democratic Club in Pennsylvania. He was a avid woodworker and hunter.

A veteran of WW II, he belonged to the 82nd Airborne Division. He received the Bronze Star for the Invasion of Normandy (D-Day). He also fought in the Invasion of Holland and the Battle of the Bulge.
