Albert E. Paige April 15, 1916 - March 19, 2012 Albert E. Paige, 95, of The Valley, in Syracuse, New York, died Monday, March 19, 2012 at Upstate University Hospital. Born in Syracuse, New York, he was the son of Arthur and Florence (McBride) Paige. He was a Navy veteran of World War II. He retired from the Syracuse Fire Department in 1974 after 28 years of service and he taught stained glass making. Al was an avid swimmer, swimming three to four times a week at Clary Middle School. He was a member of Onondaga Valley Presbyterian Church and Syracuse Rose Society. Albert is survived by his three daughters, Linda Stanko of Baldwinsville, New York, Diane Dougherty of Chiefland, Florida and Debbie Paige of Ocala, Florida; one son, Richard Paige of Green Valley, Arizona; 11 grandchildren, 14 great-grandchildren, several nieces and nephews. He was predeceased by his wife, Alice Cook Paige in 2005 and son, Albert Paige Jr. in 2006.
