Allan Robert "Budd" Farley, 88, of Jamesville, New York, passed away Monday, October 5, 2009 at University Hospital in Syracuse, New York. Born in Ogdensburg, New York, he was the son of the late Allan and Blanche (Curtis) Farley. He attended schools in Ogdensburg. Allan lived in Morristown, Ogdensburg and for the last 40 years in the Syracuse area. Budd was a tool & die maker for 50 years and a health aid for 15 years. He worked for the Standard Shade Roller Company in Ogdensburg and several companies in the Syracuse area. Budd will be greatly missed by his family and many friends. He was predeceased by his three wives, Elizabeth Brown in 1949, Monica Farrell in 2004 and Bettyjane Eskili in 2008.
