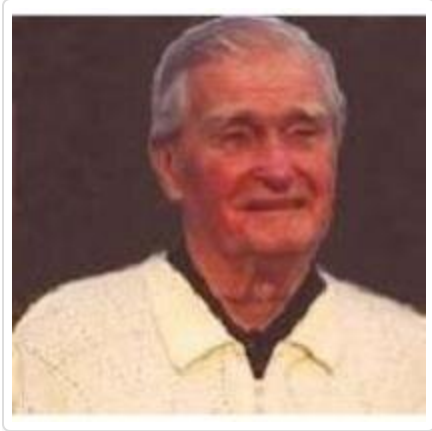




Allen B. Gilbert

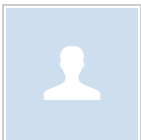

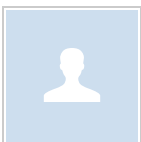
