March 23, 1919 - January 10, 2006

Bernard Aungier, 86, of LaFayette, New York, died Tuesday, January 10, 2006 at Crouse Hospital in Syracuse, New York.

Bernard was born March 23, 1919 in Syracuse, New York, the son of Edward and Julia (McManus) Aungier. He was owner of Maple Line Farms in LaFayette. He recently retired as LaFayette Tax Assessor, the longest serving Tax Assessor in Onondaga County. He was an active member of the Republican Party, a member of the Optimist Club, LaFayette Grange, LaFayette Vol. Fire Dept. and was a communicant of St. Joseph's Church. He was predeceased by his wife, Mable Schaeffer Aungier in 1996 and a son-in-law, Irving McManus in 1991.
