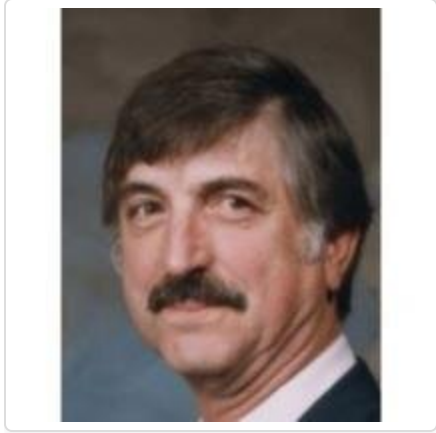




Camillo A. Vanetti
