Born in Chicago, Illinois, she was the daughter of the late Birchard and Dorothy T. Hayes. Carol, a longtime teller at Merchants Banks Elmwood branch, was also a former member of Elmwood Presbyterian Church and of the Mothers Club at Elmwood Elementary, where she was instrumental in establishing the school library. A loving wife and mother and gentle friend, she was predeceased by her husband of 52 years, Charles Walter Pangborn, and is survived by her daughter, Patricia Pangborn of Connecticut; sons, Jim (Linda Remig) Pangborn of Hannibal, New York and David (Amy) Pangborn of Syracuse, New York; brothers, Richard Hayes of Charlotte, North Carolina and J. 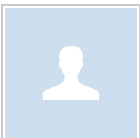

*Dear Friends and Family of Caroline (Bradbury) Hayes Pangborn:*

*My grandfather Kenneth Bradbury had a brother named Phillip, who, like many idealists of the time, left the southside of Chicago to volunteer in the Lincoln Battalion during the Spanish Civil War, fighting against Franco. He never returned. He left behind a wife, Edith, and two children, Jonathon and Caroline. My father Fabian would occasionally tell me of the lost cousins, and thought they were adopted by the Hughes family.*

*When my grandfather passed, a picture album went to my father, and when he passed it came to me. In it were old tintype photos of family members of long, long ago whom I did not know. One day I sat my father Fabian down and had him relate what he could of all the people pictured therein. Luckily, my grandmother kept some records by writing names on the back.*

*To make the story short, one was of Phillip; Caroline and Jonathon's father, in his cadet military school uniform. I had occasion to be in contact with Michelle daughter of Molly McNamee through a genealogy search, and one day I was able to contact Caroline "CubbyP" and send her a copy of the only known photo of her real father through the internet. She was overjoyed. She told me the story of her childhood and the adventures she shared with Jonathon. I even went down to their old neighborhood to look around. I live on the northside of Chicago, purely by chance. So I am writing now to express my sadness at the loss of someone I had never met, but through a brief correspondence came to know as a warm, open and expressive person, probably related as a first cousin once removed.*
