Charles C. Olmsted, 90, of LaFayette, New York died Wednesday, July 20, 2016 at The Jewish Home at Menorah Park. Born in Batavia, New York, he was the son of the late Milford and Holdiena (Helms) Olmsted. Charles was a graduate of Rose Hulman Institute of Technology in Terre Haute, Indiana. He was a Navy veteran of WW II and Vietnam. Charles retired as an electronics engineer at General Electric after 30 years of service. He was a volunteer with the Red Cross Disaster Action Team and Blood Services. He also repaired tape recorders for the blind thru the National Library System.

Charles is survived by his wife of 44 years, Phyllis Turner Olmsted; and numerous nieces and nephews. He was predeceased by his sisters, Helen Kessler, Marie Ralston and Josephine Feeney
