Donald L. Jackson, MD, 65, of DeWitt, New York, died on Sunday, July 24, 2016, at his home after a long illness. Born in Fort Cobb, OK, he was the son of Velma Owen Jackson and the late Roy L. Jackson.

Donald received bachelor's degrees in Biology and Chemistry from Oklahoma Christian University and his Doctorate of Medicine from the University of Oklahoma School of Medicine. A Board Certified ED Physician and Fellow of the American College of Emergency Medicine, he was licensed to practice medicine in Texas, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, and New York. Dr. Jackson served as Director of Emergency Medicine of numerous hospitals including Rome Memorial Hospital. Don served as President of the Medical Staff and President of the Board of Directors for Rome Memorial Hospital.

Donald is survived by his wife of 30 years Suzanne Marcinko Jackson; mother, Velma Jackson of Oklahoma City, OK; sister, Deborah Magill of Oklahoma City, OK; brothers, Mark Jackson of Ardmore, OK, and Phillip Jackson, of Sulphur Springs, TX; several nieces and nephews.

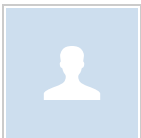

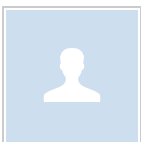
