Earl Charles Williams, 93, of Syracuse, New York died Saturday, June 7, 2008 at home.

Earl was born December 6, 1914 in Utica, New York, the son of Claude and Gladys (Vermillea) Williams. He retired in 1979 as a mechanical engineer from General Electric after 31 years and served in the Navy during World War II. A man of generosity and many talents, Earl spent his time helping family, friends and neighbors with a variety of household projects. He was a former member of the Socialist Labor Party, a member of the General Electric Chess Club and was on the Senior Cyclones Softball Team.

Earl is survived by his wife of 61 years, Olga Rebec Williams; two daughters, Patricia (Frederick) Wright of Manchester, New Hampshire and Nancy (Robert) Piscitell of Dewitt, New York; five sons, Anthony Williams of Portland, Oregon, Karl Williams of West Hartford, Connecticut, Richard (Malgorzata) Williams of Syracuse, New York, Timothy (Karen) Williams and Christopher (Felicia) Williams both of Denver, Colorado; 16 grandchildren and five great-grandchildren.

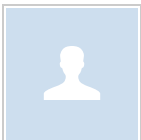
