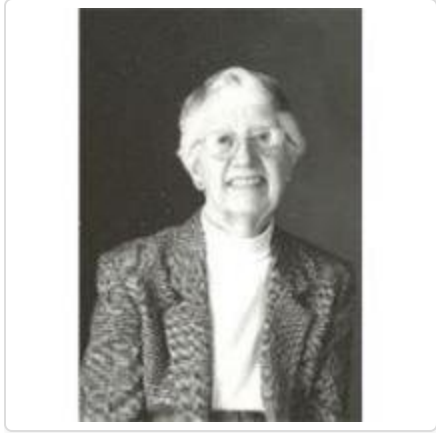




Elizabeth A. Hanlon

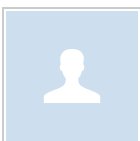

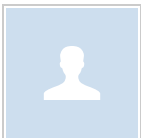
