Hazel McMillan, age 89, of The Valley, died Friday, August 27, 2004 at home.

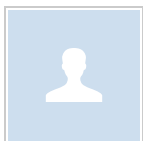

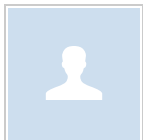
