Jane Ann Beaucage, age 85, of Syracuse, New York died Thursday, May 29, 2003 at Loretto, Syracuse.

Jane was born November 7, 1917, in New York City, New York, the daughter of John and Margaret (Berrigan) McCann. She was co-owner of Beaucage's Grocery Store in Syracuse for 20 years and was also employed as a salesperson at Cramers Specialty Clothing.
