Jane Zmyslowski Loudon of Syracuse, NY, wife of John (Jack) M. Loudon, died peacefully on Wednesday, August 13, 2014. Born on June 23, 1918 in Schenectady, NY, she was a graduate of Mont Pleasant High School of that city.
