Loretta "Etta" Camloh, 69, of Otisco, New York died Friday, March 18, 2005 at Crouse Hospital, Syracuse, New York.

Etta was born February 26, 1936 in Wilkes-Barre, Pennsylvania, the daughter of Joseph and Loretta (Nealon) Laufer. She was a bookkeeper for her husband's business, Camloh Machine Sales for over 30 years. 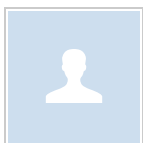

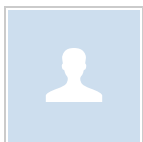
“ *It's now been 3 years and we still think of you every day. We love and miss you very much. The kids are growing, and memories fade a little every day. Looking forward to seeing you.*

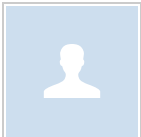
