Marianne Wulle Bradley, 81, formerly of The Valley and Manlius, died Tuesday, March 1, 2005 at Iroquois Nursing Home, Jamesville, New York.

Marianne was born September 25, 1923 in Syracuse, New York, the daughter of Arthur and Edna (Vollmer) Wulle. She was a graduate of Valley High School. She retired as a switchboard operator from Community General Hospital and as a receptionist from Employers Insurance. She was a member of Onondaga Valley Presbyterian Church. 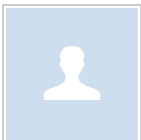
