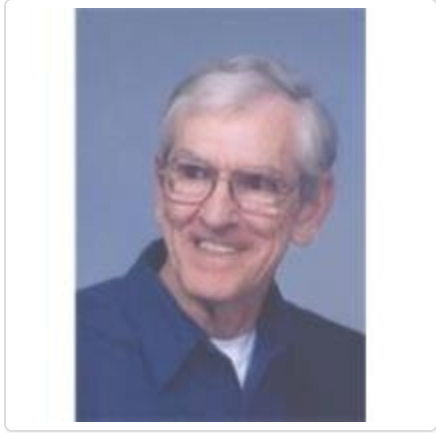




Marshall Kenneth Hopper

Marshall Kenneth Hopper, 79, of Syracuse, New York died Wednesday, September 10, 2008 at home after a long illness.

Born October 20, 1928 in Watertown, New York, Marshall was the son of Mark and Nellie (Allen) Hopper. He was a graduate of Vocational High School and was a US Naval Reserve Veteran. 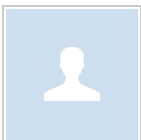

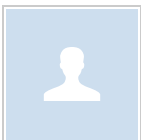
