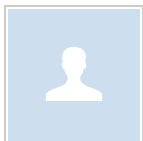
“ *I can't believe it has already been a year. I know you are happy and that God is taking excellent care of you. Please watch over all of us.*

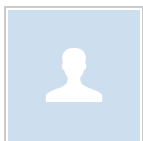
“ *Happy Birthday Mom! I miss you but am happy that you're at peace. I know you're surrounded by love.*
