Norma B. Foster died Sunday, February 1, 2004 at Iroquois Nursing Home, Jamesville, New York, three days short of her 104th birthday.

Norma was born February 4, 1900 in Gouverneur, New York, the youngest of five children born to Harvey P. and Frances E. (Miller) Bignall. She lived in Delphi Falls, New York before retiring to Syracuse, New York in 1958. She graduated from Gouverneur High School and Potsdam Normal School. 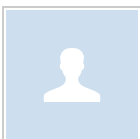

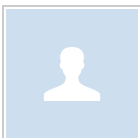

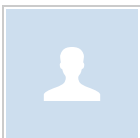
