Patsy P. Pietromonica July 31, 1919 - July 28, 2014 Patsy Paul Pietromonica, 94, of Lafayette, New York died Monday at Van Duyn following a long illness. Born in Syracuse, New York, he was the son of the late Bernard and Nicolina Baranello Pietromonica, moving to Italy at the age of 2 and back to Syracuse at 11. He was very soft spoken with a heart of gold. Patsy was a hard working family man, working three jobs simultaneously Stickley Furniture as a Boiler Tender, Professional Gardener and Franklin Furniture where he retired from in 1982 following many years of service in the shipping department. He was a decorated US Army veteran serving in the 5th Army Rainbow division during WWII where he received the Bronze Star and Purple Heart. Mr. Pietromonica met his wife in Naples while recovering from wounds inflicted north of Rome. He was predeceased by his wife the former Catherine E. Russo in 2006. Surviving are sons, Gene (Susan) of Skaneateles, New York and John Pietromonica of Lafayette, New York; daughters, Mary Ellen Delaney of Hastings, New York, Cynthia (Steve) Kosturik of Fabius, New York and Carmella Miller of Elbridge, New York; 16 grandchildren, numerous great, great-great grandchildren and nieces and nephews.
