



## Philip R. Mooney

Philip Ray Mooney, 69, of Marcellus, died Monday, October 24, 2016, with his brother, Lyn, by his side. Born in Tulsa, Oklahoma, Phil was a son of the late Lyndon N., Sr. and Alvira M. Nichols Mooney. After graduation from North Syracuse High School, Phil attended Onondaga Community College before attending the NYS Corrections Academy, where he graduated at the top of his class. He worked at several prisons around the state, was on the Crisis Intervention Team, and retired as a Lieutenant. He was also a Combat Veteran who served in the Army during the Vietnam War.

Phil was very close to his family and always there for his parents and brother. He was also a proud father, dedicated grandfather, and devoted husband. He married his wife, Patti, in Arizona and they spent time out West together, enjoyed attending plays and concerts, and going on wine tours. Phil was an avid Yankees fan, talented artist, and enjoyed racing and collecting Mopars. He was also a member of the American Legion Valley Post and Salt City Dart League.
