Walter Albert “Bud” Barr, 90, of Syracuse died Friday at the V.A. Medical Center in Syracuse. He was a graduate of Onondaga Valley Academy Class of 1943 where he was a member of Phi Delta Sigma. Bud retired from P&C Markets in Camillus following 40 years of service as Manager. He was a member of Valley Men’s Club, Post 1468 American Legion, NRA, Boy Scout Leader and a member of Atonement Lutheran Church. Walter was a U.S. Navy veteran serving in WWII. He was predeceased by his wife the former Alice Stevens, son, Walter “Andy” Barr; sisters, Lorene Barr Meldrum Joyce Barr Rouse, brother, Bruce I. Barr. 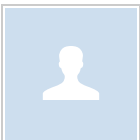
