Wolfgang W. Hoene, 66, of LaFayette, New York passed away Wednesday, August 27, 2008 at Community General Hospital in Syracuse, New York with his loving family at his side. Born in Berlin, Germany, Wolfgang came to America in 1957; he lived with his sponsor family Mr. and Mrs. Francis Woessner. He served in the Navy from 1961-1963. Wolfgang received a B. S. in Law Enforcement and Corrections from the University of Nebraska. He retired from the Onondaga Probation Department after 30 years of service. He also retired from the Air Force Reserves after 20 years of service.

He was a great hunter and loved fishing with his sons and his Gie-ga. He enjoyed all sports. He tended to his garden and fruit trees. Wolfgang spent his summers at Lake Ontario with his wife and family where he sailed his catamaran.

Wolfgang was predeceased by his brother, Joachim Hoehne in 1994, his mother, (Oma) Frieda Hoehne-Krause in 2001 and his stepfather, Walter Krause in 2005.
